
## A Quarter of Moms Are Going it Alone

About one in four mothers are raising their children on their own. While most U.S. mothers are married (68 percent), a sizable minority (24 percent) are solo moms. All told, about 9 million mothers are living with a child younger than 18, without a spouse or partner. Solo motherhood is particularly common among black mothers, 56 percent of whom fall into this category. The same is true of 26 percent of Hispanic moms, 17 percent of white moms and 9 percent of Asian moms.

emotional, or put their expectations too high," Crecelius said.

It took two cycles before she got good news. By that time, she was

juggling her own doctor appointments with those of her father, who she was taking to chemotherapy treatments.

Her father died three months into her pregnancy, year after her mother had died.

"She is an incredibly strong, independent woman who has devoted her life to the people around her," said her son, Cris, who was born Jan. 7, 1987. "She really went out of her way as much as possible to make my life the best it could be."

She keeps stacks of photo albums capturing Cris' childhood: the first swim, playing with the family dogs. "He was my focus and he

still is," she said.

Ashley Talwar won't be missing today's Mother's Day service.

She'll be front and center at First Baptist Church in Leesburg with her son,

Adam, for a baby dedication. It's a magnificent stop in a journey that began two weeks after her 2008 wedding, when she was diagnosed with endometriosis, a painful uterine disorder that also can make conception more difficult.

Doctors told her and her husband, Micky, to start trying right away if they wanted to have children, because time was not on their side.

After a year and a half of unsuccessful attempts, they visited a fertility specialist.

They tried hormone treatments, intrauterine insemination and multiple

surgeries. Nothing worked.

In 2012, after years of saving up and with help from family, they pulled together \$20,000 to try IVF.

Talwar became pregnant with a girl, and they picked out a name, Shaylee.


On Mother's Day, the couple shared the good news with their families.

Two weeks later, Talwar miscarried.

Even now, six years later, as her baby boy snatches animal crackers from a bag, she tears up when talking





### Moms, Dads Spending More Time on Child Care

Moms are spending more time in the labor force than in the past. but also more time on child care. In 2016, moms spent about 25 hours a week on paid work, compared with nine hours in 1965. At the same time, they spent 14 hours a week on child care, up from 10 hours a week in 1965. Dads, too, are spending more time in child care than they were a half-century ago. In 46 percent of households with a mother and father, both parents are employed full time.

It was holding a luncheon on the latest in IVF treatments, and Micky wanted to attend.

Though livid at the idea, Talwar agreed to do so if Micky promised never to bring up the subject again.

When she learned the clinic was giving away a free round of IVF to one attendee, she prayed, telling God that if they did not win, she would not attempt to get pregnant again.

While her husband listened intently to the speakers, Talwar doodled away furiously on a notepad. She had heard it all before, and nothing had helped.

"I was like a teenager in a bad mood," she said. "I had the worst attitude."

As the event came to a close, Talwar was thrilled to leave. But first, they waited for the announcement of the IVF winner.

"Just be happy for the winner and be grateful you can get out of here.' That's what I was telling myself as I heard my name called," she said.

Adam was born in an emergency caesarean section on Father's Day 2017.

"I could not be more grateful or more happy with this little guy," Talwar said. "He makes me laugh. He keeps me awake, but it's OK."

Though she is excited to celebrate her first Mother's Day, Talwar is mindful of other


