

Take a trip down Dali Lane

St. Petersburg's Salvador Dali Museum is this up-and-coming, art-conscious city's \$30 million pride and joy. Housing the world's largest number of Dali works outside his hometown museum in Figueres, Spain, the gallery has a comprehensive collection spanning the artist's career, including The Hallucinogenic Toreador and seven other masterworks. Visit Thursdays for \$10 admission after 5pm (regular entry \$24). → 1 Dali Blvd (727-823-3767, thedali.org)

Walk on the wild side

Take a Floridian walking safari through Boyd Hill Nature Preserve, where the \$3 admission grants you access to nearly six miles of trails, 245 acres and six ecosystems. Try to spot wild animals like nest-prepping bald eagles, whitebilled coots, marsh rabbits and the state's official reptile: the American alligator. → 1101 Country Club Way S, (727-893-7326, stpeteparksrec .org/boyd-hill-nature-preserve.html)

Have a cheeseburger in paradise

Established in the 1930s by an English expat, the casual, flip-flop-friendly The **Chattaway** serves the best burger in town according to locals. Eat outside on the pink and green patio, where you can enjoy a mix of eclectic old Florida decor, like hand-painted, flower-filled antique claw-foot bathtubs and Christmas lights. alongside London Underground signs. → 328 22nd Ave S (727-823-1594, thechattaway.com)

Opened in 1924, St. Petersburg Shuffleboard Club is the oldest (and largest) club of its kind in the U.S. and the inspiration behind Brooklyn's Royal Palms Shuffleboard Club. On Fridays, hit up the popular BYOB-only St. Pete Shuffle night, when all the courts are free (first-come, first-served), and local bands drop in.
