
Here's how to transform this invitation into an origami butterfly model!


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
Start with the paper white-side up. Fold the paper in half and open it, then in half again the other way.
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
Fold the paper in half diagonally, then open it and fold it again the other way.
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
Fold each corner into the middle.


Flip the folded paper over and fold each corner into the middle again.
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Unfold, then with the white side up fold the outer edges into the center line.
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
From the top, pull the corners open, but just a little.
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
Fold the pocket you've just made into the center.
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Rotate and repeat so it looks like the image above.
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Fold the top part over, backwards, so the edges of the paper are exposed.
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Fold the first set of outer corners down along the creases you have made.
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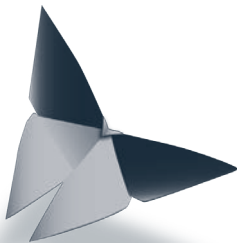
Fold the outer corners of the front flap, as shown above.
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Fold the model in half, backwards, so you still see the folds we made in the last step.
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Pinch along the line and fold to flatten each "wing" from the top.
