According to Lalah "It took me over the course of ten long years to complete "Out Run the Sky" My biggest challenge was trying to figure out my song selections, only because I wanted to have the greatest album possible. It was crucial that I make good song choices. I'd start picking songs and then I'd change my mind. I love all of my songs, I didn't have any favorites and that made it much harder for me. It's like having a lot of children; you try not to have favorites, because they are all different. With my songs they all have different meanings for me and that's why it was so hard to choose."

On her current album Ms. Hathaway did a remake of Luther Vandross's "Forever, For Always, For Love" She lamented: "I never got a chance to meet him, but I'm sure that he did hear my version and he possibly loved mine as well." This song is also featured on a tribute CD for the late singer.

Lalah has had an amazing musical career. When asked about what it was like to work with so many talented artists and musicians her response was humbling: "I can honestly say that the best thing about my career is that I get to work with my awesome mentors. In a way I feel very blessed, I realize that everyone does not have access to that kind of experience that I have been privileged to encounter. I'm open to learn all that I can and I know that it can only help me become the best person that I can be."

Ms. Hathaway has made guest appearances on many albums which include: Grover Washington, Wayman Tisdale, Marcus Miller, Meshell Ndegeocello and Joe Sample. According to the music critic Craig Chapman "Lalah's collaboration with Joe Sample on "The Song Lives On" is brilliant, and should be a fixture in everybody's music collection." On that one song the world is granted a delicate treat via Lalah's smoky and sultry voice fused with the mellow piano tunes seducing us from the finger tips of Joe Sample. Lalah confided how her father's life and death influenced her life as his kid. "I was ten years old when daddy died. It is still being revealed to me everyday. I feel his presence all the time. I feel I'm honoring my dad with what I'm doing. I'm sure he'd be very proud of me. I know my mom is and that's enough for me."

It must really be a really awesome feeling to hear your recording on the radio for the first time...inquiring minds wanted to know and Lalah was happy to supply the answer. "This was awhile ago when I was living in Boston, while I was in college. At the time when we heard the song we were riding in my friend's car and my song was played on an am station. I had to pause a moment, then we all got excited."

Speaking of getting excited Ms. Hathaway has branched off into other well known fields. Such as advertising: she's sang a commercial jingle; "Umm Good, Possibilities" "Yeah, I've had one jingle and I would like to do more. I had fun doing that!"
