Two die: gunshot wounds

Perry County Sheriff Gary Schaaf says it could have been a murdersuicide of a man and woman.

A possible murder-suicide — or a possible double-suicide, according to Perry County Sheriff Gary Schaaf — is being investigated after a male and female were found dead in a Highway E residence Friday around 2:15 p.m.

Victims are Perryville residents Shawn Galeski, 36, and his girlfriend Jamie Cole, 29.

Both died from a single gunshot wound to the head. They were found at Galeski's residence, located at 3247 Highway E, in a locked room upstairs. A gun was located in-

Thursday began as a typical day for the Grass family, with morning errands to run before their workday began.

Kim Grass and her children Paige Johnson, 19, Lukas Welton, 12, and stepson Clayton Grass, 10 - made a trip to Perryville from their home in Ste. Genevieve to take care of a few things: Lukas had an appointment with a Perryville dentist to get a few teeth pulled; Paige wanted to inquire about a car she'd been eying at her great-aunt and great-uncle's auto shop in Perryville; and Kim had to go to work at the Perry County Health Department. The errands took longer than expected as Paige hurried to drop her mom off at the health department — Paige was worried she'd be late for work at McDonald's in Ste. Genevieve, and she still had to bring the boys home.

Ground broken for memorial wall

An official groundbreaking was held Friday for the Perry County memorial wall, erected to remember fallen or living local veterans.

The wall, which has been a work-in-progress for two local historical preservation entities for roughly a year, will reside in the Perryville City Park near the old history museum.

Friday, members of the

Perry County Military History Museum Committee and the Perry County Historical Society came together to celebrate the groundbreaking, as did a handful of city officials. And, as if it couldn't be more appropriate, the groundbreaking fell on Flag Day.

History Museum Committee Member Mike Lundy gave a brief speech to the crowd Friday, explaining that this wall started out as just a dream.

"We knew what we wanted, where we wanted it, but we didn't know how to do it," Lundy said. "... I think that what we do today will be something that all of us will be proud of for the rest of our lives."

He quoted Abraham Lincoln's Gettysburg Address.

"... we cannot dedicate, we cannot consecrate, we cannot hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled here, have consecrated it, far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember, what we say here, but can never forget what they did."

Perryville Mayor Debbie Gahan said a few words as



them," said Donna Steele, Kim's aunt and co-owner of Dan's Auto Body in Perryville.

At roughly 12 p.m., Paige was navigating a 2000 Pontiac Grand Am on Highway 61 into Ste. Genevieve, her brothers buckled up in the backseat. As she was nearing the intersection of Highway 61 and Buehler Road, Paige attempted to overtake another vehicle. Somehow, she overcorrected and lost control, sending her vehicle straight into oncoming traffic, striking a 2003 GMC Ford Sonoma driven by Dennis Klump, 52, of St. Genevieve.

Klump came away from the accident with what the Missouri State Highway Patrol described as moderate injuries.

The three siblings, however, would share a different fate. Lukas and Clayton were pronounced dead at the scene, and Paige would

die hours later in a St. Louis hospital.

The Missouri Highway Patrol spent hours in their attempt to reconstruct the accident Thursday, but they also had a more difficult task: to tell Kim about the death of the two boys and the critical injuries — at the time — that her daughter sustained. Witnesses at the Perry County Health Department say Kim was inconsolable at the news.

Just after, the President of the Perry County Board of Health, Yvonne Steinbecker, who was not at the health department, received a call from a staff member insisting she arrive right away.

"I was speeding to get

there, but I don't know why," Steinbecker said. "When I got there, there was a note on the door that said [the department] was closed."

The health department remained closed Friday, out of respect for the family. Holding back tears, Steinbecker shed what light she could on the children.

"Lukas just celebrated his 12th birthday last Monday [June 3]," Steinbecker said. "Paige attends a local community college."

Lukas and Clayton were students at Ste. Genevieve Public School. Ste. Genevieve Elementary Assistant Principal Geri Diesel said Clayton would have been a fifth-grader in the fall, and Lukas would have been a seventh-grader.

"Our whole town is just heartbroken," Diesel said.

Kim Grass' husband, David Grass, is Clayton's father, and Lukas and Paige's stepfather. Clayton's mother is Shelly Boyer of Bonne Terre, Mo. Lukas' father is Ronald Welton, and Paige's father is the late Danny Johnson.

Paige was both a varsity softball player and varsity basketball cheerleader at Ste. Genevieve High School. She graduated in 2012, and Steele said Paige just finished her first year as a radiology student at Mineral Area College.

"[Paige and Lukas] were Kim's only two children," Steele said. "They were basically her world. She was pretty much the only parent in their life. Then she married David, and they were a blended family, but they all thought the world of each other."

According to Ste. Genevieve Coroner Leo "Chipper" Basler, Lukas and Clayton's time of death was 12:33 p.m., Thursday. Paige was pronounced dead at Barnes Jewish Hospital at 4:15 p.m. later that day. All three passengers were wearing seat belts at the time of the crash; Klump was not.

To support the grieving family, the recently formed organization Perryville Cares will kick-start a fundraiser this week.

"Now, let's shovel some dirt!" she said.

The 20-foot-wide wall will be comprised of different-sized bricks, purchased through the community, engraved with respective veterans' names. The wall would tentatively allow for 160 bricks, though in the future, could potentially expand to accommodate more.

Those contracted to complete the project include Ed and Quint Robinson, of SEMCO Stone, and Duane Ernst, of Ernst Construction. The project is estimated to cost roughly

\$40,000. Lundy said a deal was established between the contractors and the committee where, once the wall is completed, the committee would reimburse the contractors for materials and labor with money generated through brick purchases. Remaining funds would serve as proceeds to the committee.
