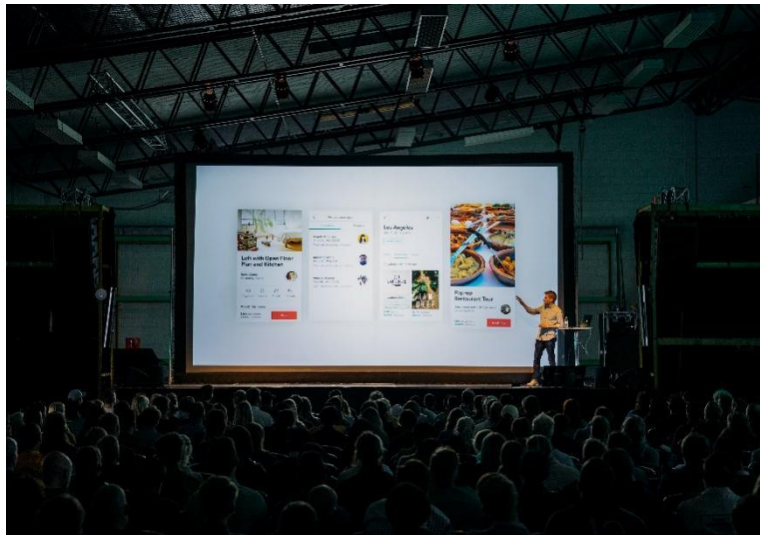

4. Transitions

Transitions are a feature in PowerPoint that can be a lot of fun to work with. Transitions are a perfect addition if you are making this presentation as a creative project for family or for fun. To add a transition to your slide, go to the transitions tab. This will allow you to see all the transition options. You can also see a

preview of what your transition will look like. You can use transitions for more professional presentations as well but will need to be a little more mindful of the transition you choose to avoid one that is too distracting.
