Portland is an ideal place to begin a professional career. With its churches, great schools, festivals, museums, and shopping centers, Portland is also a top choice to raise a family. Portland residents are an eclectic mix of individuals and part of what makes the city so unique.

Where to Stay

If you're planning a visit to the city, there are many places to stay that are comfortable and affordable. For stays in the city, the Days Inn, the Hampton Inn, the Holiday Inn and the Portland. Marriott are all within half a mile of the Maine Mall in the heart of South Portland. The Days Inn is the most affordable, with rooms starting around \$100 a night, and a room can be reserved at the Marriott, Hampton, or Holiday Inn for around \$200 a night. If you prefer an artistic setting, there is another Holiday Inn located in the Arts District, along with the Eastland Park Hotel, which is about the same price. For accommodations closer to the ocean, try the Portland Harbor Hotel, the Portland Regency Hotel or the Hilton Garden Inn, located near the Old Port. These are more luxurious accommodations and a bit more expensive, but you can reserve a room for around \$300 a night.

Where to Eat

There is no shortage of great places to eat in Portland, Maine. Maine is known for its selection of seafood, potatoes, and fresh fruit, among other foods. To get authentic Maine seafood, try Portland Lobster Company, which has everything from lobster to clam chowder, as well as a variety of sides to choose from. This was named one of Maine's best restaurants in 2011. Five Fifty-Five is another choice, serving cheese dishes, sweet desserts, wine, vegetarian options, and steak. For a completely vegetarian option, try the Green Elephant Vegetarian Bistro on Congress Street or O'Naturals on Exchange Street. For an authentic Maine dessert, go to Maple's Gelato, a restaurant that uses fresh ingredients in its frozen treats.

Places of Interest

One of the first things that often strikes visitors about this city is the culture. Portland is an artistic city that has its own Arts District with historical museums and art exhibits. There are also plays, music festivals, and other events that take place throughout the year. Not surprisingly, one of the most popular summer activities in Portland is going to the ocean. Old Orchard Beach is only about 30 minutes from the city. Old Orchard has sandy beaches, gorgeous views, great food, and even rides to enjoy. There are also several other beaches in nearby Scarborough, such as Ferry Beach and Scarborough Beach State Park. If you like shopping, there are many options throughout the city. The Maine Mall in South Portland is the biggest mall in Maine and offers a variety of stores and smaller shops. For athletic

events, check out a <u>Portland Sea Dogs</u> game at Hadlock Field in the summer or attend a <u>Portland Pirates</u> Hockey game at the Cumberland County Civic Center in the winter. To relax at the end of the day, consider looking into the <u>Casco Bay Lines Ferry</u>, where you can take a peaceful tour along Maine's coast.

These are only a few places that make the city of Portland, Maine an incredible destination. To experience it yourself, plan a trip to Portland, Maine this year. This is a unique city, different from many other popular vacation spots.
