Higher Ground

If you only have time to sample one of Melbourne's highly sought after brunches, make Higher Ground your number one choice. Yes, you may have to queue for an hour to get yourself a table (no bookings are taken for breakfast) but it is worth it just for the incredible setting. Housed in a disused power station, the bare brick walls with minimal and leafy interior, create a pleasant ambience to enjoy a delicious brunch whilst sipping away at a fresh fruit bellini cocktail.

For a classic and unbeatable dish try their ricotta hotcakes and pair them with the lamb fry-up for an Instagram worthy brunch.

The Grainstore

If you're struggling to get yourself a table at Higher Ground, The Grainstore is just round the corner and a close second when it comes to brunching in the city. The setting is a little simpler, but the incredible cake display and selection of coffees on offer really sets this place apart from the rest. Their menu is inventive, and we are yet to have a bad dish, despite some of the risky and unusual combinations often seen on the menu. Think pork belly, sweet potato rosti and a chilli caramel on the side...

The Premises

If you're looking for something a little further out of the hustle and bustle of the city centre, The Premises is your best bet. Located in Kensington, a friendly, family suburb, this café has recently become a popular hide for mid week brunch. They offer a limited but quirky brunch menu and a selection of homemade cakes, including plenty of gluten free and vegan options.

The smoothie bowl comes highly recommended, perfect to restore all those nutrients after a busy weekend.

Industry Beans

In the quirkier suburb of Fitzroy you can find Industry Beans, a café that has become somewhat of an institution in Melbourne. With a coffee roaster on site you'll find a fresher coffee hard to come by. In fact, they have won an award for the Best Boutique Coffee Roaster in recent years. On a sunny day the outside
