

3 Males arrested in Kensington linked to Liverpool Womens Hospital Remembrance Day Bomb

On the 17th November, a bomb disposal unit was deployed to Sutcliffe Street and Boaler Street in the Kensington area of Liverpool, as several suspicious packages were found in one of the properties, linked them to the Remembrance Day bomb.

Chief Constable Serena Kennedy explained in the Police Statement: "Three males have today been arrested in the Kensington area under the Terrorism Act and remain in custody and enquiries remain ongoing."

Emma Cassidy, 21, a teacher living in Kensington said: "Kensington can be scary on a normal day, never mind not knowing a suspected terrorist could live next door."

Elle Lowry, 23, a Masters student living in near the Women's Hospital bomb site said: "It is so awful, it could have happened anywhere in town, I don't feel safe at work, I don't feel safe at university, and I definitely don't feel safe on the bus."
