Cafe Zarah

Gulou's hidden music escape and cafe

The narrow streets of Beijing hutongs are a treasure trove of undiscovered coffee shops, eateries, and quirky novelty stores. Set along a busy main street in the hip hutong area of Gulou, you'll find an industrial-chic cafe that has become a favourite hangout for freelancers, coffee lovers, and music aficionados. Housed in a renovated ancient Chinese courtyard, Cafe Zarah, started by a Cerman-Chinese duo offers a trendy space that is accepting of all. As you walk by the cafe, the makeshift street-step patio silently commands your attention and beckons for you to enter.

To enter one needs to pass through the floor to ceiling glass doors. Once inside, the expansive space that welcomes you is light and airy, and is complemented by the polished grey concrete walls, strong wood and steel accents, and striking minimalistic decor. As you walk through the cafe, the radiant sunlight beaming through the glass casings lead you to the charming outdoor terrace. The fusion of Chinese architecture with each design element work in tandem to create a European vibe that is the perfect blend of "east meets west."

The menu is Chinese and European inspired and offers authentic European breakfast, tasty small bites, and delicious lunch and dinner options. The cajun spiced potato wedges and pizza boazza are favourites, as well as the soft fluffy waffles. For the drink enthusiasts, the coffee is of superior quality and the unique cocktails change according to the seasons.

What gives Cafe Zarah an edge over other cafes in the area is, when the sun goes down the cafe transforms into a groovy ambient space, with low lighting and a DJ spinning only the finest deep house, techno and electronic beats. If you're a music snob, an avid coffee lover, or someone who enjoys their own company Cafe Zarah is a place that should be on your list.

TELL US ABOUT YOUR PERFECT BEIJING DAY



Close your eyes, take a deep breath, and let your imagination take hold. Now, slowly drift to a place where you aren't afraid to dream big. Consider this: if your free time was in abundance and your budget significantly bloated, how would you spend your perfect day in Beijing?

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On every turn, Beijing has something unique to offer – from coffee shops to museums, and parks to art galleries, and answering the question may seem challenging. However, a recent article by Travel and Leisure titled "How to Have the Perfect Day in Beijing," may help with some answers. The essence of the article is a simple yet unique itinerary that begins with a morning of gallery hopping, and coffee-sipping at the Meridian Space, followed by a visit to a studio owned by Ma Ke, "the fashion designer who makes pieces for China's first lady." The day then begins to evolve with a stop at Old Beijing's Sino-French University to see the Chinese-European imports at Yishu 8 gallery while moving towards the Forbidden City, a stop highly recommended by the author. As the day unwinds, a visit to the top of Jingshan Park is on the cards for 360-degree views of Beijing which is a sight to behold, before heading to Capital M for a nightcap. As enticing as that itinerary sounds, we know that some Beijingers might deem it too pretentious, so for something more akin to what our readers might recognize, Metro UK compiled several suggestions and called it a guide on "How to live like a local in Beijing." Their guide takes you on a journe to experience the non-touristy side that Beijing has to offer. Metro UK's guide includes a visit to Great Leap Brewing and The Taco Bar in the opulent Sanlitun area, a stroll down the effervescent Ghost Street, and a cultural stop at Lama Temple or Beihai Park. The guide also somewhat inexplicably suggests, a stay at the Conrad Beijing, where a one-night stay in a double bedroom (RMB 1,600) is equivalent to one-quarter of the average Beijinger's monthly wage. "How to live like a rich white girl in Beijing" may have been a more apt title for that piece.


Meanwhile, back at the Beijinger, we would rather opt for one of the following plans to have a perfect Peking day:

Watery hutong happenings:

Begin the day with a skate or boat ride on Houhai lake (depending on the time of year), followed by a steamy, saliva-inducing Mongolian hotpot at Nanmen Suanrou (the most underrated hot pot joint in town). Top this off with an aimless stroll through the nearby hutongs and along the lake, watching as the light of dusk reflects on the water.
