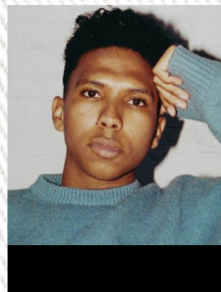


10 Black

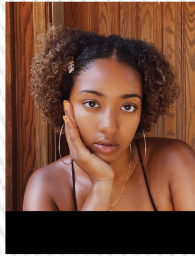


Tyler Mitchell

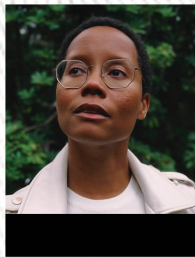


Mahaneela

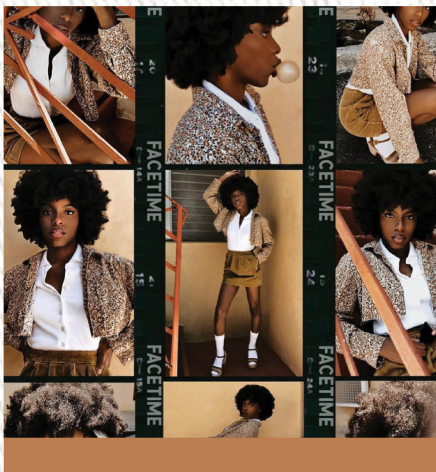


Dana Scruggs

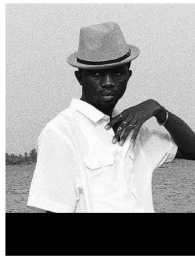


Shaniqwa Jarvis

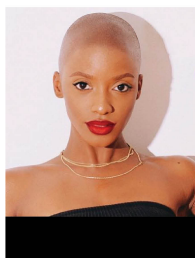


Daniel Obasi
