up to the challenge course and believing in myself...



There is only one person whom I look up to in regards to pursuing art as I have known her all my life. Therefore, it brought us both joy to be able to work on this article together. Fresh from Seattle, Washington is my cousin, Migley Nadine Ocampo, who works as a graphic artist. She has been in her field of occupation for about four and a half years now as this includes her internship for two years at her current workplace which then became her full-time job. She has discussed the problems and difficulties in her job as everyone has different challenges to face through their everyday work life. One of the challenges she faces daily is pleasing the client while still adhering to company standards and staying true to her art style. She specified how, most of the time, they are given free reign when it comes to designing event art or logos. However, at the end of the day, clients still have to give their approval. During the design process, it can sometimes be like pulling teeth with requests like "make that bigger", "take that out", "add this in", etc. They seem like simple changes, but moving or adding just one thing can change the overall look and feel of a design and the other surrounding art elements may be changed.

"Oh-- don't even get me started on fonts! There is an endless number of fonts available out there and finding the 'perfect one,' let's just say, can be a journey."

Moreover, she has said that she finds a lot of satisfaction in creating fresh and new designs. Unfortunately, during the busy seasons, her team would have to pump out a lot of designs to keep up with demand which causes her design process to be more formulaic rather than creative, especially when sponsor logos need to be incorporated. Some sponsor logos have strict guidelines that they have to follow as to not conflict with their branding, and this can be restricting when it comes to the designing process. Of course, in working, Migley also gets satisfaction when she gets to meet eye-to-eye with her client on the design. Regardless of how they get there, whether they made no changes or a dozen changes, as long as the end product is a design she is proud of and the customer genuinely likes, she is beyond happy.

In maintaining work-life balance, Migley states that it is a work-in-progress. She makes an effort to be completely present and focus at work regardless of what else is going on in her personal life.

"When I'm at work, I work. And when I'm off the clock, I try to focus on personal interest and other responsibilities."

As I am about to enter college, I have also asked her if the academic preparation she studied for was enough for her current job, and she gave a neutral answer for it. It is not enough in the sense that in college, she majored in studio arts and studied animation. Her plan was to work towards a career as a studio artist, an animator, or 3D modeler in the animation industry. As a result, she wasn't able to take classes pertaining to graphic designing because of scheduling conflicts and availability as design classes are usually reserved for design majors. Although, she honed her artistic and creative skills in traditional arts which she was able to translate to graphic arts. She was able to familiarize herself with computer programs on the job as well as on her free-time.

"Working traditionally and graphically is very different, but I found that I enjoyed working with images, logos, and typography, and make the abstract messages and ideas into something more tangible."

Along with her full-time job, she also runs a side business in which she commissions work ranging from wood art to logo work. She also enjoys tabling at multiple art conventions throughout the year. Currently, Migley and her friends have started working on platforming a game which is still in its beginning stages. When it's ready, they hope to make it available for the public to enjoy.

Finally, I asked her about her personal mission statement and motto to which she answered full heartedly, "My mission is to grow my small art business enough that I can make enough profit to have it as my full-time job. I plan to achieve this by continually creating new art and to make my online shop life. To add to that, I will apply to as many art events and conventions.
