

CO-OP PROGRAMS

Engineering and Computer Science

Full-time, paid work experience for six to eight months

- Undergraduate engineering and computer science students can begin the full-time co-op program after the first semester of their junior year. The program is also available for graduate-level computer science students. More than 80% of the students who have graduated from the program have received job offers from their co-op companies.
- The co-op program has 200+ corporate partners, including Canon, Estée Lauder, Gerber Technology, Google, GroupM, IBM, JFK Airport, Stantec, UPS, Veeco and Zebra.

MBA

Full-time, paid work experience for three to five months

- Complete a paid co-op experience with leading corporations in New York City and on Long Island. About 70% of students land a full-time job with their co-op partner or with a competitor in that field.
- Full-time co-op MBA corporate partners include CBS, Comedy Central, The Madison Square Garden Company, Northwell Health, Paramount, Peloton, PwC and Pharma Corp.
