What is the Peppol Network?

Peppol is a set of artefacts and specifications that facilitate cross-border eProcurement. This international eProcurement framework is developed and maintained by OpenPeppol.

OpenPeppol is an international nonprofit association that standardises the structuring and exchange of information.

Peppol uses a 4-corner model to exchange procurement documents and data (including elnvoicing). Procurement documents and data are transmitted through a secure network of approved services known as access points.






Access points (e.g. your accounting software) connect you to the Peppol network and allow you to exchange electronic invoices and other documents with your registered trading partners. Interoperability means data can be exchanged seamlessly even if trading partners are using different systems.

The different technical standards, service specifications, and regulations mandated by Peppol authorities have kept the Peppol network safe. This is why so many governments around the world trust it.





Compared with emailed invoices (which can be easily infiltrated by scammers who doctor fake or duplicate invoices and reroute payments into their own accounts), secure systems like Peppol will safeguard your financial assets and significantly minimise your exposure to invoice fraud.
