

BELOW THE SURFACE

Skeleton dials reveal the intricate inner workings of these tough timepieces

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Don't be fooled by the nontraditional shape of the Bell & Ross BR-XI Tourbillon R.S.18; it's a classic Bell & Ross timepiece that possesses the same level of craftsmanship, precision, and design excellence that's become synonymous with the Frenchbred, Swiss-produced watches. With a hand-wound flying tourbillon and a four-day power reserve, the R.S.18 is a precision machine that sacrifices none of its timing perfection for its aesthetic brashness. While the three chronographs on the face may grab one's attention, the real beauty is the intricate nature of the 282 components tucked within the sculpted titanium case. Water resistant down to 100 meters, the R.S.18 is the perfect everyday wristwatch for a man of style, as appropriate in a boardroom as it is jumping off the deck of a superyacht into a turquoise sea. The production run is limited to only 20 units, so despite a price of \$189,000, this is surely an edition that won't be available for long.
