<u>Cemetery Revolutions – How Natural Burial in</u> **Australia Can Realign Perception**



Eco-friendly alternatives to traditional burial are becoming increasingly popular today. Previously, we've discussed the environmental and health impacts of traditional burial which tends to involve embalming and the use of caskets. As we've outlined, cremation is resource-intensive and high in pollutants For many, the question of whether this is sustainable practice moving forward, as climate change gathers momentum, is moving many towards considering green burial options. Opting for green embalming or to be buried in a simple shroud is just one piece of the puzzle.
