1. Haji Lane

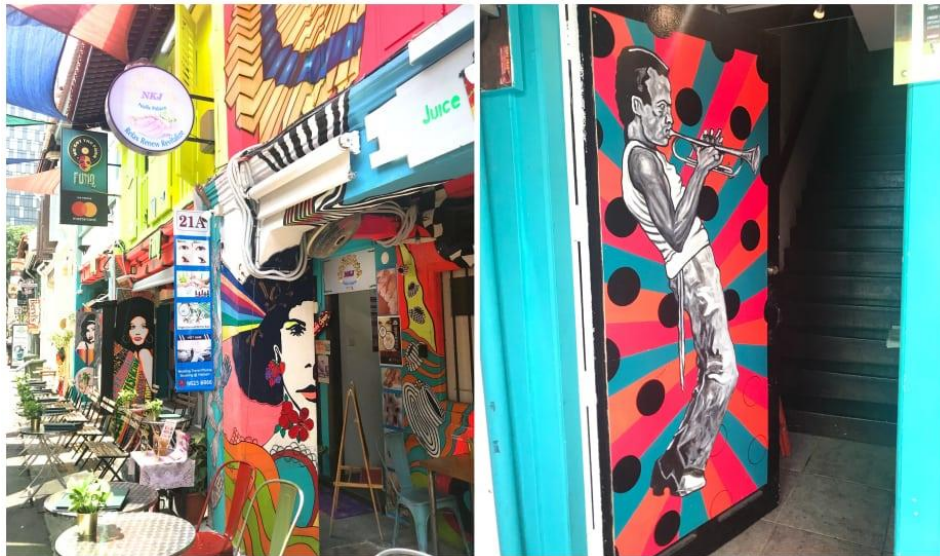

In this particular street, you can find small galleries, curated boutiques, and even rare stationeries with originals and artisans goods. The murals on the cafes and shop's walls will satisfy your thirst in aesthetics. The murals are one of the hidden gems in Singapore due to the country's policy banned it once, but discovering the business potential and collaborative manner of the local artist's enthusiasm, it is now considered as the creative business centre that brings inspiration to the community.

How to reach:

Haji Lane is located close to the downtown area of the city. The nearest MRT is Bugis Station which pops you out just 500m from the entrance.

2. Gardens by The Bay

In this conservatory you can find the rare species like Diana's Dracula, with exotic red orchids bloom, and try your luck to find sprouted flower of Lithops, the plant that resembles the human brain. In Cloud Forest, you can also step into the realm of paradise where you can cloud walk to see world's tallest indoor waterfall. The Garden standard rate:

Two Conservatories

How to reach:

Address: 18 Marina Gardens Drive, Singapore

Take MRT and Alight at Marina Bay MRT Station and walk to the Circle Line. Catch the Circle Line from Marina Bay MRT Station to Bayfront MRT Station. Get off at Bayfront MRT Station and go out the Exit B.

3. Joo Chiat Road

Singapore is the best known with the rich Peranakan culture. In Joo Chiat Road, you can find the A to Z, from the culinary, architecture and special sundries. The Intan is the first and only home-museum owned by Alvin Yapp, with numerous of antiques reliques and vintage furnitures from his Peranakan roots. You can also fulfill your curiosity and step in to the 100-year abandoned mansion, Istana Woodneuk. Joo Chiat Road's scenery is old-school and vintage, imagine walking to a different dimension and fulfil that wanderlust soul in you. So put on your walking shoes, prepare your map and explore the classic vibe!

How to reach:

The 2 nearest MRT stations to Joo Chiat are Eunos and Paya Lebar.

For trip with bus, take the bus 15, 16,33 or 155.
