Of those, nearly half are treating patients who live in federallydesignated Health Professional Shortage Areas.

The School's success in meeting the health care needs of Georgia residents has received national recognition. Mercer School of Medicine consistently ranks No. 1 in the country in the percentage of graduates choosing to enter primary care and has received numerous awards for its success in educating and motivating students to pursue careers in family medicine.

As part of the curriculum, Mercer Medical School faculty have established more than 200 preceptor sites throughout the state, where local physicians provide medical students with hands-on training and observation. As teachers, these physicians must stay on the leading edge of new advances in medical treatment — a benefit to our students and to the patients they treat.
