
Thank you for adding your name to our petition. By joining us in our mission to help women in our community out of poverty, you have shown that you care for your most vulnerable neighbours.

All over the world, women are disproportionately experiencing poverty compared to men.

My name is Katherine Kalinowski, and I am a passionate advocate of women's rights. I've made it my life's mission to make a difference in the lives of women who are working to overcome hardships and homelessness – and I'd like you to join me on this journey.

In our community, women are more likely than men to be living on a low income.

Here's how poverty affects women in our city:

- 1 in 5 women in Hamilton are living in poverty.
- Hamilton's single women have the highest poverty rates among Ontario's cities.
- Children and women ages 15 and over represent almost two thirds of Hamilton's total low-income population.

In this great country of ours, it is inexcusable that poverty remains a major issue. Almost 2 million women in Canada live on a low income. The gender pay gap adds to this problem. For every dollar that a man makes, women earn 72 cents. These women could be struggling to afford the cost of housing, feed their kids or pay monthly bills.



But solutions do exist. Investing in affordable, low barrier housing and empowering women with personalized support, resources and guidance can help them escape poverty – and change their future forever.

At Good Shepherd, we provide programs and support services to help more women in our community move themselves and their families out of poverty and have the chance to build healthy, productive lives.

When Paula first came to Good Shepherd, she was scared and embarrassed. She wasn't used to asking for help. She lived a good life as she put it. "I married my high school sweetheart. We had a beautiful daughter, a nice house, and a comfortable life."

But over the years, all of that changed. Paula was increasingly subjected to unleashed abuse from her husband. Until one day, fearing for her and her daughter's safety, Paula made the brave decision to leave him, even without knowing how they would survive. She just couldn't take it anymore.

With nowhere to go, no job as she had taken time off to look after her family, and no means to support herself and her 15-year-old daughter, Paula found herself in a desperate situation.

"I struggled to afford food, clothing and basic necessities. Life was really tough. I knew I needed help but didn't know where to start. When I reached out to Good Shepherd, I was a complete mess. I was crying and could barely get the words out," recalls Paula.

"I lived through some really dark days," shares Paula. "But with the support of Good Shepherd, I am a different person today. My dream for my daughter is to build a career that she is proud of. And my goal is to become a successful entrepreneur, be able to stand on my own feet, and one day buy a home."

Thank you for supporting our petition demanding affordable housing for women in our community. Together, we can help women out of poverty and give them the opportunity to make their own way forward.


