Dear Salutation,

Thank you so kindly for your support and generosity through these difficult times for all of us, especially the vulnerable people we serve.

Poverty is crippling. It damages individuals, families and ultimately everyone in society.

Even though we live in a prosperous country, poverty remains a major issue. What's even more devastating is that in neighbourhoods across Canada poverty affects women more than men – and our community is no exception.

It may surprise you to hear that in Hamilton 1 in 5 women are living in poverty. And that children and women make up almost two thirds of our city's low-income population.

I'm deeply concerned when I read these statistics, <FirstName>. The unfortunate reality is that women in our neighbourhoods are more likely than men to be living on a low income, especially young, single mothers and senior citizens.

Over the past year, we have seen the pandemic and economic upheaval make life even more difficult for women who are living on the edge of poverty. As a result, there has been an increase in the number of women experiencing domestic violence. While for most of us staying at home meant staying safe, for those women who experience abuse at the hands of their partners, home is a dangerous place.

But over the years, all of that changed. Paula's husband became controlling and abusive. After years of living in fear for her and her daughter's safety, Paula made the brave decision to leave her husband, even without knowing how they would survive.

With nowhere to go, no job as she had taken time off to look after her family, and no means to support herself and her 15-year-old daughter, Paula found herself in a desperate situation.



"I struggled to afford food, clothing and basic necessities and was constantly worried about my daughter and how all of this would affect her," recalls Paula.

BY THE NUMBERS Women's Poverty in Hamilton

Single women in Hamilton have the **HIGHEST POVERTY RATES** among Ontario's cities.

1 IN 3 single mothers are raising their children in poverty. **But less than half** of all shelters in the Greater Hamilton Area are for women.

Children and women represent **almost two thirds** of Hamilton's total low-income population. Yet, **ONLY 1 IN 4** shelters take in single mothers and their children.

DID YOU KNOW? Good Shepherd operates more than half of all shelter space for women in the Greater Hamilton Area.

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Together, we can help women move out of poverty and build healthy and stable futures for themselves!

DID YOU KNOW? Women face a much greater risk of poverty than men.



Here's why: Women are found more often than men, working minimum-wage jobs and without social protection and often have to choose between working or taking care of their children or elderly family members. As primary care givers, many women have limited independent income, which makes them vulnerable to falling into poverty if a relationship breaks down.

WHEN PARENTS ARE NOT LIVING TOGETHER, women are more likely to take on the financial cost of raising children.

WOMEN ARE PAID LESS THAN MEN, even when they work in the same positions and the same hours. On average, women earn just **87 cents for every dollar** earned by men.



Our Response

Good Shepherd is supporting women on their journey out of poverty.

We offer a range of innovative services to women and their children experiencing poverty, homelessness, domestic violence and mental illness. Our doors are open **365 DAYS A YEAR** to women seeking safety, support and services to help them move out of poverty and rebuild their lives.



Here's How:

Martha House

Martha House offers short-term accommodation for women and their children who are homeless and fleeing violence and abuse. Last year, we provided beds and essential services to **MORE THAN 700 WOMEN AND THEIR CHILDREN.**

Mary's Place

Last year, Mary's Place provided safety, support and emergency accommodations to **OVER 200 WOMEN** dealing with homelessness, poverty, abuse and mental health issues.



Community Support Services

We run a range of services to help women and children experiencing various issues, including domestic violence, childhood abuse, mental health issues and difficulties navigating the legal system.

Second Stage Housing & Transitional Housing and Support

This service provides affordable housing and women-centred programs to help women and their children who have experienced violence gain greater physical, emotional and financial stability.

This program helps women and their children in accessing services required to move out of violent and abusive situations and establish a safe and stable environment. We do this through counselling, safety planning, support with education, affordable housing, health and wellness and other services.
