

Establishment of Canada's Newest National Park

Over 13,000 square kilometres of Boreal habitat and the species that thrive in it will receive permanent protection with the creation of the Mealy Mountains National Park Reserve, the largest national park in eastern Canada.

Nationwide Stewardship of Birds and their Habitat

The launch of the Canadian Important Bird Area Caretakers Network will help to create a network of volunteers who will act as the eyes, ears and hands on the ground at more than 500 Important Bird Areas from coast to coast, ensuring local conservation ideas are being put into action.

Legal Victory for the Endangered Sage Grouse

The chances of survival for the Greater Sage Grouse, a prairie bird whose population has plummeted over 90% in the last two decades, are greatly improved thanks to Nature Canada's scientific review that helped to bring about a ruling that forces the federal government to identify the species' critical habitat.

Conserving Birds and their Habitat



Birds do so much for us. They brighten up our days with their cheerful songs, alert us to the arrival of spring and keep our ecosystems running smoothly by controlling rodents and insect pests. And as one of the best-known groups of living things and one of the most studied, birds serve as valuable indicators of environmental change. Through our partnership with BirdLife International, Nature Canada works both on a national and global level to provide strong stewardship of bird populations and their critical habitat. With your support, we are actively monitoring and conserving a network of more than 500 Important Bird Areas across the country, empowering Canadians to become stewards who make a difference for our birds and collaborating with BirdLife partners worldwide to protect migratory bird populations beyond our borders.

Fighting on Behalf of Endangered Species

Every year, more of our country's treasured animals, birds and plants are threatened with extinction. Habitat loss and degradation, our changing climate and Canada's weak wildlife protections laws are contributing to the growing list of species whose survival is in jeopardy. SPECIES SPOTLIGHT:



Woodland Caribou

The woodland caribou is just one of the hundreds of Canadian species whose future is uncertain. Once found in abundance throughout Canada's forests, these majestic creatures are shrinking in numbers. Logging, mining and other industrial development throughout the Boreal forest are fragmenting and destroying the habitat critical to this forest-dwelling species.



Preserving Wildlife Places

From vast prairie lands and stunning cobble beaches to rugged mountain ranges and abundant forests, Canada boasts some of the most incredible and unspoiled natural beauty in the world. Unfortunately, unrestricted industrial development, human activity and changes in climate are threatening to cause tremendous harm to our country's magnificent natural spaces and the wildlife that thrive in these habitats. To preserve Canada's natural heritage, Nature Canada keeps a constant watch on government plans to establish protected areas like National Parks, National Wildlife Areas and Migratory Bird Sanctuaries from coast to coast to coast. We also undertake efforts to identify, monitor and protect Important Bird Areas – sites that are essential to healthy bird populations. By working with government, scientists and local communities, we are leading the way in safeguarding our country's wild spaces.

Connecting Canadians to the Natural World

Canadians live in a land rich in natural beauty, yet fewer of us than ever have a personal connection to the natural wonders that surround us. Even more alarmingly, today's children and young people are spending more time indoors, far removed from parks, wild places and natural areas. Nature Canada recognizes there is an urgent need to reconnect Canadians with nature and instill love, appreciation and respect for our natural heritage in children and adults alike. Through community engagement programs, outreach materials and volunteer initiatives, we are working to raise awareness and educate Canadians about nature and the role we can all play in protecting it for future generations.

QUICK FACTS

Since 1989, Nature Canada has led the efforts to protect more than 63 million acres of precious wildlife habitat.

As the Canadian co-partner in BirdLife International, we helped to develop conservation plans for 136 Important Bird Areas (IBAs) across Canada, supported more than 150 grassroots bird conservation projects and invested close to \$450,000 in on-the-ground projects involving IBAs.

Since the Parks and People program was created, more than 60,000 children have had the opportunity to explore our magnificent natural heritage through guided hikes, overnight camping trips and outdoor activities.
