high-quality.

"You'll get a lot more variety here," Dowling said.

While some local businesses have been dealing with the Black Friday crowds for years, others are just learning how to navigate the holiday as a small business.

Southern Sisters Boutique & Embroidery owner Kayley Nobles said the store was better able to anticipate the number of shoppers this year after experiencing the store's first Black Friday last year.

"Last year was our first Black Friday and we didn't really know what to expect," Nobles said. "We were really underprepared. When Black Friday was over we barely had anything left in the store."

Southern Sisters Boutique & Embroidery is offering 15 percent off a total purchase from 9 to 11 a.m. Friday, 10 percent off from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and 5 percent off from 2 to 5 p.m. "This year we're much more prepared," Nobles said. "The earlier you come the better." Shopping at a small business has more of a fiscal impact on the community than shopping at a chain or large business. According the to American Independent Business Alliance, on average, 48 percent of each purchase at local, independent businesses is recirculated locally, compared to less than 14 percent of purchases at chain stores. "The mom and pop businesses, the small businesses, are the ones that make a lasting impact on our community," Lake City-Columbia County Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Dennille Decker said. "Everything we invest in them they invest back into the community."
