63RD ANNUAL COLUMBIA COUNTY FAIR

Between the dazzling attractions, thrilling rides, carnival games, food and entertainment, there is no shortage of fun to be had at this year's Columbia County Fair.

The 63rd annual Columbia County Fair will open on Friday, Oct. 27 and will close on Saturday, Nov. 4. This year's fair is expected to be bigger and better than ever with crowd-favorite performers returning and new acts coming to wow the audience.

"We're looking for a bigger turnout this year than we've had in the past," Columbia County Resources President Mike Nelson said.

Returning to the Columbia County Fair for his 18th year of performance, illusionist and hypnotist Ron Diamond will once again mesmerize the crowd with his unbelievable magic tricks and illusions. Don't miss your chance to see one of the fair's most beloved entertainment acts.

"He's like family," Nelson said about Ron Diamond. "If he didn't come I don't know what we'd do."

Also returning to this year's fair are the kid's pedal tractor pull and Fast Action Motorsports Entertainment. Both of these attractions will allow visitors to fulfill their need for speed. At the kid's pedal tractor pull, children ages 4-12 will have the chance to race pedal-powered tractor replicas for prizes. If you're looking for something a little more high-speed, the Fast Action Motorsports Entertainment R/C race track will give you the chance to race opponents and the clock with remote-control cars for a spot in the championship.

There will be some new entertainment on the midway this year as well thanks to A Grizzly Experience. This educational grizzly bear show and exhibit will give spectators an up-close and personal look into the lives and habits of real grizzly bears! Crowds will surely be impressed by the bears' impressive sizes and amazing behavior.

Visitors can also get a sky-high look at the fair with helicopter rides or spend time cuddling up with and feeding some farm and exotic animals at the petting zoo. The fair will also feature its signature livestock show, where young men and women of all ages will show and sell their project animals, including cows, goats and pigs. There will also be a poultry and rabbit tent at the north end of the food court area.


"We've had to extend the barn out to accommodate all the cows and pigs and goats," Nelson said. "It should be competitive and exciting."

In the fairground's banquet hall, located directly off the midway, visitors can see displays from some of the area's local crafts-people who are competing for prizes in categories such as canning, cross-stitching and sewing. There will also be exhibits from local schools displaying their students' works.

Two large exhibit buildings on the fairgrounds will showcase presentations and displays by local businesses, organizations and churches.

Admission to the fair costs \$5 at the gate, and those tickets include access to exhibits, entertainment and the livestock shows. Children five years and under get in free.

The general nature and objective of Columbia County Resources, Inc. is to provide a program of activities with the people of the county to further develop education, agriculture, horticulture, livestock and other resources of Columbia County. The first Columbia County Fair was held in 1938. Fairs were not conducted from 1941-1953 due to the outbreak

and aftermath of World War II, but were resumed in 1954 at the urging of County Extension Agent Neal Dukes. Columbia County Resources contributes to and provides support for the local 4-H and Future Farmers of America (FFA) programs, Take Stock in Children, Parents United Together, Kiwanis, Shrine Club, Boys & Girls Club, Senior Services, CHS Band, Dugout Club, Muscular Dystrophy and Florida Sheriff's Youth Ranch. The complex is used as a staging area by Florida Power

and Light and the Forestry Service in times of disaster. Two scholarships are provided annually through the local high schools. Columbia County Resources annually hosts the Columbia County Fair, Florida Gateway Pro Rodeo, Tough Enough to Wear Pink and Smokin' Pig Fest BBQ Cook Off. INFORMATION BOOTH: Located at the end of Building Number One and will be open during the hours of the Fair. The information booth is available for lost and found, security and first aid.

ADMISSION: Daily admission is \$5.00. Persons under 18 will be admitted free on School Day. College students will be admitted free by presenting identification cards. Senior Citizens will be admitted free on Saturday, November 1 & November 8.

RESTROOMS: Are located on the west side of Exhibition One in the Entertainment Building, as well as a number of Porta-Potties located on the grounds.

PARKING: All parking is free. Adequate parking is available. We ask the cooperation of the public in utilizing the parking area as directed. All exhibitors, workers and visitors are asked to park in the lots between the hours of 10:00 am and 11:00 pm each day. Special permission MUST be granted for entrance to the grounds during these hours. You must obtain a vehicle pass at that time.

All exhibitors and participants must have a day pass for each day for entrance to the Fairgrounds. Two passes per day will be given for each booth. Livestock exhibitors will be given passes at the time of entry. The Fair Association will not be responsible for any lost passes. All additional passes will be offered to the exhibitor at \$3.00 each.

PREMIUM: All checks for premium monies awarded in connection with the fair shall be negotiated by the recipient/payee within 60 days from the date of the check, time being of the essence. If the recipient/payee fails to timely negotiate said check, all monies due recipient/payee shall be deemed to have make an unconditional and irrevocable qift of said monies to the Fair.

INTERPRETATION OF RULES:

The management of the Columbia County Resources, Inc., Columbia County Fair and The Youth Livestock Committee reserves the right to amend, add to and interpret the following Rules and Regulations and to arbitrarily settle and determine all questions and differences in regard thereto, or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to the fair. In the event of conflict between the General Rules and the Special Rules which appear as head notes of various Divisions and Departments of the fair, the latter will take precedence.





Kids

Pedal Tractor Pull

If your kids are feeling the need for speed, make sure you stop by the Kids' Pedal Tractor Pull at the Columbia County Fair, where children can put the pedal to the metal and race for prizes and bragging rights.

The kids who participate in this event will test their strength and speed while they race in loaded tractors on a course made to look just like a farm, barn included. Whether they can make it down the raceway with 20 or 200 pounds, every child will have a blast.

Children ages four to 12 are eligible to enter the tractor pull, which will take place every day at the fair. The kids will love racing their tractors down the 25-foot path to the finish line, where prizes and cheers await each participant.

The vintage 1950's highly-modified tractors are attached to weight-transfer sleds which change based on the age of the rider. As they pedal down the path, the weight transfers to the sled and makes it harder to pedal.


If they make it to the end, the child achieves a "full pull," and from there they move into the finals with increased weight, with some kids being known to pull up to 500 pounds.











welde's Big Bear Show


Show sends spectators a vital message of conservation and preservation for all bear species.

Not everyone gets the chance to race cars and win trophies. However, at the Columbia County Fair, everyone will have the opportunity to race for a victory at the Fast Action Motorsports Entertainment interactive R/C race track.

Participants will have complete control of their stock cars, tough trucks, hot rods or tuners on this micro-reality race track. This attraction takes the real excitement and competition of race car driving and shrinks it down to a fun, family-friendly scale that everyone at the fair can enjoy.

Drivers will have complete control of their cars as they race them around the track by using

a steering wheel wired to drive the remote-controlled car. Competitions are exciting with FAME's computerized lap counting system. As the race begins, a professional announcer will explain the rules of the road, "happy hour" (practice) will start and then the real race will begin.

Drivers will qualify during a series of elimination races, and trophies will be awarded until the final race and then the Grand Champion is determined.

This interactive attraction appeals to all ages whether you want to be a driver or a spectator cheering your favorite racer to Victory Lane.

Gliding over the Columbia County skies is by far the most exhilarating way to see the Columbia County Fair. All the bright lights and attractions can be seen from high in the sky thanks to helicopter tours that will be returning for this year's event.

While attending the Columbia County fair, visitors will have the opportunity to see Lake City from a new point of view if they chose to take a ride with Leading Edge Helicopters.

The helicopter rides will be available every day during the fair. The cost of a helicopter ride is \$20 per person. The company also takes photos of the passengers before, during and after the flight, which are available for purchase for an additional rate.

Fairgoers can experience the thrill of flying with this Orlando-based helicopter tour company, and see the entire fair and the city from up in the sky.





Exhibitor General Information


- 1. It is mutually understood and agreed that the Columbia County Fair shall not be held responsible for any unforeseen happening such as personal injuries, delays, strikes, cyclones, rains, fire or any act of Providence over which they have no control.
- 2. The Management will not be responsible or liable for safety of articles or displays or personal belongings left unattended. However, every precaution will be made to prevent theft or damage to exhibits. (A night watchman will be on duty each night of the Fair).
- 3. Any persons trespassing upon the grounds, climbing over fences or otherwise fraudulently gaining admission, will be arrested and prosecuted.
- 4. All exhibitors, privileged persons and their helpers shall be subject to such rules as the committee may set and for refusal to comply may be barred from entrance.
- 5. Rights are reserved to inspect, at any time, any show, concession booth, stall or animal on the grounds.
- 6. Exhibitors showing or offering any article for sale will be considered commercial and will be charged according to rates set up by the exhibit committee.
- 7. Each entry or each unit in a display shall be considered an exhibit.
- 8. The Fair Association will provide backdrop and side curtains for each booth and or display. Each group will need to furnish materials for construction of display racks, shelves, etc., not to exceed 4' in height on each side. No display materials shall extend outside the marked booth space.
- 9. **UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES** are you allowed to pin, tape, or wire anything to the curtains. They have been treated with a fire-retardant. You will be requested to remove any items or they will be removed by Fair Officials.
- 10. In each of the other Exhibit Buildings or Outside Exhibitors, the Exhibitor will be responsible for building siding (not to exceed 4 feet in height) and backing for your booth. Each group entering any booth will be responsible for furnishing materials for construction

- of display racks, shelves, etc. No display may extend outside the marked booth space.
- 11. No crates, barrels or packing boxes will be permitted to remain within exhibit areas after the contents have been removed. No coolers, drink bottles or other litter will be allowed in any aisle.
- 12. Exhibitors will be held responsible for the cleanliness of their exhibits and the space surrounding them.
- 13. All exhibits in the various departments must be in the building and completed for display no later than 5:00 pm, Thursday, October 26, 2017, unless otherwise indicated in this bulletin. Booths will be judged Friday, October 27, 2017, at 9:00 a.m. Absolutely no one will be admitted into exhibit areas during hours of judging or during closed hours of the fair.
- 14. You may not sublet your space out. All rentals must come through the Fair Office.
- 15. **EXHIBIT BUILDINGS** will be open for set up as follows: Monday, October 23 Thursday, October 26: 8:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m. **NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE!**
- 16. Exhibitors are responsible for the delivery of their supplies before and during the Fair.
- 17. **EXHIBITS MUST REMAIN INTACT UNTIL 10:00 P.M. ON THE LAST NIGHT OF THE FAIR.** Breakdown may begin at 8:00 a.m. on Monday, November 6th. Exhibit Buildings will lock down at 5:00 p.m. "Promptly." Breakdown will continue at 8:00 a.m. Tuesday. All exhibits must be completely removed no later than 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, November 7.
- 18. PREMIUMS will be designated by ribbons; FIRST blue; SECOND red; THIRD white.
- 19. ALL FIRST PLACE premiums and other claims will be paid by the Fair Association within 30 days AFTER the close of the Fair.
