

# NEIGHBORHOOD SNAPSHOT

#### TOP EXPERIENCES

- Treat yourself: Gangnam has the crème de la crème of Seoul's pampering luxury hotels, fine dining restaurants, flashy clubs, and spas.
- Shop the Beverly Hills of Korea: Apgujeong Rodeo Street has the greatest concentration of high-end designer brands on the peninsula.
- Make a K-pop pilgrimage: From K-Star ROAD to the company that signed BTS and the Psy Gangnam Style statue, this is the spot for diehard fans.
- Soak in the serenity: A stroll to Bongeunsa temple or a cruise along the Han River reminds you that Gangnam is more than bright lights and flashy cars.
- Lose yourself in Starfield COEX: More than just a mall, Starfield also has a movie theater, an aquarium, and the Starfield Library.

#### **GETTING HERE**

The best way to reach Gangnam is by subway. Jump on Line 4 going south at Seoul Station and transfer to Line 2 at Sadang Station. This will take you to Gangnam Station and Samseong Station (World Trade Center Korea), which are two of the sprawling district's central points. You can also take Line 4 east from Seoul Station and transfer to Line 3 at Chungmuro Station. This will take you south to Apgujeong Station, another neighborhood hub. A taxi from Seoul Station to Gangnam Station will cost you \$\mathfrak{#}15,000 to \$\mathfrak{#}20,000. Driving is also possible, but be warned the parking is tight and expensive.

#### PLANNING YOUR TIME

You'll want to dedicate at least a day to Gangnam, or more if you're particularly into shopping or getting pampered. While any time is a good time to visit, weekends can get crowded, especially at shopping malls and restaurants. Visiting during the week will help you beat the crowds, but you may get caught in traffic during rush hour times. Like the rest of Korea, Gangnam is safe 24 hours a day, though travelers should exercise basic caution at night.

#### **PAUSE HERE**

■ Yeoksam Park, This little green space on the top of the hill behind Gangnam Station is the perfect place to take a break from the hustle and bustle of one of Seoul's most hectic districts. It contains walking paths and a pavilion, and is a great place to check out the cherry blossoms in the spring. It's also home to a nice garden, as well as an extended clan of friendly cats. 🖂 Yeoksam-dong, Gangnam-qu Gangnam Station. Exit 12.

#### VIEWFINDER

■ Gangnam Style Hands **Statue.** This piece of public art outside of COEX complex commemorates singer Psy's megahit, "Gangnam Style." The large bronze sculpture is constructed in the shape of the singer's hands as he did his distinctive "horse dance" in the music video. If you step onto the stage under the hands, it will play the megahit song for you, and you can take the opportunity to give the dance your best shot. ⊠ Youngdongdaero 513, Gangnam-gu Bongeunsa Station. Once known only in Korea as a ritzy neighborhood for the affluent Seoul set, Gangnam burst onto the world stage in 2012 with singer Psy's megahit, "Gangnam Style." Combining elements of hip-hop, K-pop, and electronic dance music, this incredibly catchy tune swept the globe like wildfire, while its cheeky video which skewered the district's reputation for worshiping wealth—became the first ever to break one billion views on YouTube. This was more than just a song: it was a phenomenon, cementing the Seoul neighborhood's status as not just a heavyweight in Korea, but also an international influencer.

It wasn't always like this, however. Up until the early 1980s, Gangnam—which is the city's third largest district—was one of the least-developed areas in the capital. Since then it has undergone a massive transformation, with the once-sleepy old neighborhoods and side streets giving rise to towering buildings of concrete, glass, and steel.

The result is that parts of Gangnam now feel very much like New York or Chicago. It's a place of gargantuan skyscrapers, taxi-jammed roads, and bustling sidewalks full of people who know where they're going and intend to get there quickly. This is a neighborhood that stops

for no one, and while it may seem a bit cold and impersonal at times, this is the price you pay when you want to hang in the big city.

In Gangnam, money is indeed the name of the game. It's not uncommon to see residents driving Ferraris or Lamborghinis down the road during lunchtime. The locals are impeccably dressed, often sporting brands seen in the windows of the district's myriad luxury shops, and its real estate prices have gone from high to stratospheric in recent years, turning a whole generation of apartment owners into overnight millionaires. Walking

among its urban canyons, you can almost taste the cash in the air.

While such ostentatious displays of wealth can be off putting, they can also be attractive. If you want to see what life is like in the "Beverly Hills of Korea," then look no further. And the concentration of prosperity in Gangnam has also given birth to creativity. The district is home to art galleries, fashion design houses, and several entertainment companies that supply the songs and talent for the K-pop juggernaut, arguably the country's most important current export, and among its most lucrative.

However, for all of the bright lights, luxury malls, and other gold-gilded bells and whistles, Gangnam is a place where people actually live, work, and play. Of course the shopping is great, but it's also home to some of the city's best restaurants, cafes, and hotels, as well as parks and cultural sights such as tombs and temples. And despite the generally high prices, a visit to Gangnam doesn't have to break the bank. If you look closely,

there are plenty of hidden gems that are on par with any other neighborhood in Seoul, pricewise.

At this point in the city's evolution, you really can't say you've experienced modern Seoul without spending at least a day in this dynamic, flashy, and essential part of town. Like anywhere, the splendors will become apparent once you've put your feet on the ground and explored the place yourself. And who knows? You just may find yourself caught up in the action and dancing along to Psy's famous song.



# Banpo Hangang Park

CITY PARK | Though technically in neighboring Seocho District rather Gangnam proper, this large riverside park is close enough to warrant a visit. Lazily stroll along the river walk, check out the **Banpo Bridge Rainbow Fountain** (which, at 570 meters/1,870 feet long is the largest bridge fountain in the world), rent a bicycle, or picnic on the grass. In the warmer

months (April through October) the park hosts the Bamdokkgaebi Moonlight Market every Friday and Saturday night from 6 to 11 pm. This popular event attracts people from all over the city to browse the artist's stalls and graze on food truck fare, featuring Korean classics such as tteokbokki (rice cakes in sweet spicy sauce), along with foreign favorites like tacos, hot dogs, and Cuban sandwiches. The trio of man-made floating islands known as Some Sebit are also not to be missed. Each features a building lit-up at night by multi-chromatic LED lights and are constructed to represent the three stages of the life of a flower. # Big Hit Entertainment (original building)

NOTABLE BUILDING | Seoul is home to a number of entertainment companies, but Big Hit Entertainment is known as the outfit that launched the careers of global K-pop mega sensation BTS. While they've since moved into a brand new headquarters (the 19-story HYBE Building in Yongsan), this much more humble structure where it all started still stands. The building has become a pilgrimage point for diehard BTS fans known as ARMYs, where thousands have scribbled words of dedication to the group on the outside of the structure. ⋈ 10-31 Nonhyeon-dong, Gangnam-gu M Sinsa Station, Exit 1.

#### **\*** Bongeunsa

TEMPLE | Situated just north of COEX Mall, this beautiful Buddhist complex is an oasis of tranquility in the amped up concrete and steel environs of modern Gangnam. Built in 794, the temple is home to 3,479 Buddhist scriptures, making it much more than a tourist attraction in the heart of one of Seoul's most modern and hectic districts.

#### Dosan Park

CITY PARK | Established in 1973, this cool little park is dedicated to the memory of Ahn Chang-ho (pen name "Dosan"), a key figure in Korea's independence movement against the Japanese occupation. The park contains his statue, as well as the Dosan Ahn Chang-ho Memorial Hall, a kind of mini-museum dedicated to the life and times of this man dear to the hearts of so many Koreans. The park is a perfect place to take a break from the bustle of the city while also reflecting on figures like Dosan who sacrificed it all to help pave the way for a prosperous and free Korea. ⊠ 10-6 Dosan-daero 49-gil, Rodeo Sation, Exit 5.


# Gangnam Meat Alley

STREET | Sitting just two blocks behind Gangnam Station's Exit 10, this narrow concourse is home to scores of barbecue restaurants as well as pocha, the Korean drinking-establishments serving up side dishes known as anju. In the warmer months the outdoor patios are packed with a young crowd eating and drinking and living it up. The atmosphere is lively and infectious, and while you may have to wait for a table on the weekends. the opportunity to sit outside, nibble on grilled meat, and wash it all down with a bottle or two of soiu should not be missed.

#### Garosu-qil

Seoul's aptly named "Street of Trees." The number of trees lining this shady 700 meter-long (2,297 feet) street is challenged only by the number of its boutiques, cafes, and restaurants. While other neighborhoods in Gangnam are packed with international brands, Garosu-gil is still dominated by locally produced goods and cafes. While not necessarily the place for traditional souvenirs, Garosu-gil is a good stop for some relaxing boutique shopping and watching the world go by from one of its many cool cafés. # **K Museum of Contemporary Art**

ART MUSEUM | Featuring paintings, sculptures, installations, performances, and video projects by artists from both Korea and abroad, the museum emphasizes interaction between the audience and the artist, and the curators aren't afraid to put forth challenging and experimental work. Gangnam has grown into one of the country's creative hubs, and the K Museum of Contemporary Art is a great place to visit if you want to put your finger on the pulse of the currents informing and inspiring the modern Korean arts scene. ≥ 807, Seolleung-ro, ➡ 13,000 ♥ Closed Mon. ■ Apquieona Rodeo Station, Exit 5.

#### K-Star ROAD

STREET | Located along the strip of highend designer shops near Apgujeong Rodeo Station, this attraction features a series of cute bear statues inspired by K-pop acts such as BTS, Psy, Blackpink, and more. While not necessarily a mind-blowing experience, the photo ops are a must for any hardcore K-pop aficionado. ⋈ 407, Apgujeong-ro, Seoul Apgujeong Rodeo, Exit 2.

# My Art Museum

ART GALLERY | This small gallery located in the basement of the Textile Center building next to Samseong Station features an exhibition space shop, cafe, and

# ★ The Royal Tombs of Samneung Park

TOMB | Both a much-welcomed swath of nature as well as one of the city's greatest historical treasures, this UNESCO World Heritage Site is home to the burial mounds of two kings and one gueen from Korea's Joseon era, King Seongjong-widely considered to be one of Korea's great leaders—is buried with his wife, Queen Jeonghyeon, in the park's west side, while the east side contains the tomb of King Jeongneung, their second son. While the history is impressive. the park also offers visitors a chance to unwind, exercise, and otherwise soak up fresh air in the midst of Gangnam's Seoul : Free M Seonjeongyeong Station, Exit 3.

#### \* Starfield COEX Mall

STORE/MALL | This sprawling complex is more than just a shopping destination: it's the mothership of trendsetting fashion, food, culture, and entertainment in Seoul. The largest underground mall in Asia, COEX is home to shops carrying national and international brands, as well as restaurants serving cuisine from around the world, plus a movie theater. an aguarium, and the Starfield Library, where you can browse through thousands of books or just relax under the skylight roof. It's a great place to lose yourself for a couple of hours, and when you feel like coming up for air, make sure to stroll along the grounds outside and check out the giant golden sculpture of Psy's hands as he does the "Gangnam Style" horse dance.

\$ | KOREAN | This highly praised restaurant serves Pyeonyang naengmyeon (cold buckwheat noodles), which is a must-try dish during any visit to Korea, especially during the blistering summer months. Chef Kwon Hee-sung prepares the beef bone broth every day, and uses only the freshest, local ingredients to elevate this beloved yet humble dish into something really special. Known for: cold noodles; loyal following; hand-made dumplings.

#### Hanool Dak Galbi

\$ | KOREAN | Always a hit with visitors to Korea, dak galbi (stir-fried chicken) is the perfect combination of savory, spicy, and sweet, and it's cooked up in a sizzling pan right in the middle of your table, which adds a touch of theatrics. This popular neighborhood joint serves up dak galbi in its purest, most unpretentious form, while still managing to be pretty close to the rest of the nightlife action. Known for: proximity to bars; neighborhood favorite; chicken cooked tableside.

This restaurant serves up several different cuts, so you're best off ordering the mixed grill. # **★** Jungsik

Jungsik specializes in course meals that draw from a variety of influences, but are always given a distinctly Korean touch. The service is kind, attentive, and discreet, the atmosphere chic, and the wine list is custom-curated to pair with the current menu. \$ | KOREAN | Chicken is huge in Korea, especially when paired with beer, and Kkanbu is a Korean chain that serves up many varieties of the bird, including basic crunchy, spicy barbecue, garlic soy sauce, as well as boneless pieces fried up with pieces of squid. Whatever your preference, the Samseong branch has it all, but make sure to wash it down with a cold glass of beer or two. Known for: boneless options; garlic soy sauce chicken; cold beer.

The funky Apaiuieona restaurant also has scores of quality brews on tap that perfectly complement their pies. #### Starbucks Seoul Wave Art Center

\$ | CAFÉ | While this Seattle-based coffee behemoth boasts more than 500 stores in Seoul, this branch in the Han River Park may be the shiniest diamond in the crown. Occupying the first floor of the Seoul Wave Art Center, this is the only floating Starbucks in Korea, and surely the most Instagram-able. # 👽 Nightlife

As one of Seoul's largest and most vibrant neighborhoods, Gangnam has a multitude of great nightlife options that match a range of tastes and budgets. From cocktail bars to craft beer pubs, there are loads of hopping places to choose from, with plenty of opportunities to soak up the glitz and glamor for which this part of town is famous. However, it's not recommended to visit the big clubs despite Gangnam's reputation as a clubbing center. Unfortunately, most of these establishments currently practice a "Koreans only" admission policy, and those that are willing to admit foreigners will likely only do so under the condition that you spring for prohibitively expensive table/bottle service. All of these clubs also check IDs, and for the most part any one over the age of 35 will be barred entry as well. South Korea still lacks a national anti-discrimination law, which sadly makes these kinds of practices possible. If you're keen to hit the clubs in Seoul, we'd recommend you do so in other neighborhoods such as Hongdae or Itaewon where the club culture is much more inclusive than that practiced in Gangnam.
