Education in an

era of uncertainty

K-12 classrooms are undergoing a rapid state of flux following a period of unprecedented and historic disruption. Yet, while remote learning became the norm during the height of the global health crisis, that transition already was underway. Administrators, teachers, students, and parents were already contemplating the unpredictable future of online education, and where it might take them.

For example, a survey conducted by Echelon Insights found that when parents were asked which ways they preferred their child attend school for the remainder of 2020 school year, 22% responded part-time in-class and part-time remotely or online. As many as 45% of parents answered only remotely or online.1


Of course, one of the biggest hurdles that school districts faced when classrooms shifted online was ensuring that students had the technology and internet access to participate in remote learning.

This so-called "homework gap" disproportionately affects Black, Latino, and Native American households, with one in three lacking high-speed home internet. Meanwhile, in rural areas, two in five families lack high-speed home internet.

With the advent of new federal grants issued to local school districts across the country—the American Rescue Plan includes \$122 billion targeted at education—there is every reason to be optimistic about online education, particularly in support of blended and flipped classroom models that integrate in-class and virtual learning environments.

According to a nationwide study by the Alliance for Excellent Education,² at the start of the pandemic:

169m children did not have access to high-speed home internet 73m children did not have access to a home computer,




