Kargus featured the Donut Drive-In on Route 66, in part due to fond childhood memories, "It was a real treat to go there as a kid. We'd watch them make the donuts, and it smelled heavenly. It still does!" The giant Vess soda bottle, formerly of south St. Louis, also gets its due along with Ted Drewes and other nostalgic landmarks.

"St. Louis Splendor" has been a top seller at indie bookstores for several weeks and will surely be a popular holiday gift. One reason for its success is the relaxing effects coloring can have. "Many people have told me that coloring helps them unwind; it can have a meditative quality. It's a great – and creative - way to de-stress", says Kargus.
