With Intelligence has learned he has been hired as a partner will serve in what was described as a "broader role" across the asset management client business. A formal announcement is expected later in the year with more details.

With Intelligence also revealed earlier today that GSAM's global head of ETFs Michael Crinieri had left the firm.
