St. John Greek Orthodox Church Cancels its Annual 2020 Tampa Greek Festival

Our First Responsibility is to the Greater Community

Tampa, FL. September 28, 2020 – In the best interest of our community, the Tampa Greek Festival will not host its unique weekend of food, faith, and culture. For 39-years, "Eat, Dance, and Be Greek!" rang throughout South Tampa as friends and neighbors eagerly awaited our freshly-prepared dishes, invigorating music, and lively dancing.

However, in response to these unprecedented times, we choose to forego our iconic festival in an effort to ensure the safety of our visitors, sponsors, vendors, parishioners, and volunteers.

The Tampa Greek Festival is a ministry of the St. John Greek Orthodox Church, and is its major fundraiser. St. John's is led by Father Stavros Akrotirianakis and Pastoral Assistant Charlie Hambos and is the only Greek Orthodox church within Hillsborough County.

This extraordinary effort, which traditionally attracts nearly 10,000 people over a three-day weekend, requires thousands of hours of volunteer effort to transform our property into a showpiece of live music, family-friendly fun, and community goodwill. These volunteers are the heart and soul of our church and we would never put their health at risk.

Reflecting Mathew 25 Outreach, we feel our greatest gift in hosting the Tampa Greek Festival is not in the funds we procure but in the good we give. Each year, St. John's donates 10 percent of its net proceeds to local charities, having supported both LifePath Hospice and Love INC. To date, we are grateful to have shared more than \$100,000 with these important organizations.

This year, in spite of our choice to act as socially responsible stewards of our faith community, we will continue to support our local ministries: LifePath Hospice, Love INC and Feeding Tampa

Bay. Each organization acts as a critical resource for our community and we are proud to share our stewardship with them.
