Often dubbed the "improved Henry" following the American Civil War and "the Yellowboy" by Native Americans, the Winchester 1866 lever-action rifle is a brass-framed, 44 caliber rimfire that was coveted for its repeating rifle qualities and its distinctive gold plating. Carried by Texas Rangers, Army Scouts, hunters, and more, the Winchester 1866 remains one of the most popular antique firearms researched by collectors.

## Colt 1873 Single Action Army
