WHAT IS VIGIPIRATE?

DESCRIPTION

- Vigipirate is a three-tier <u>alert</u> system that informs the French public of terror threats.
- Each level grants the government powers to manage emergency crises.
- Additional powers can include increased military deployments and the <u>ability</u> to send mass communications about terror threats.
- An increase in alert level **does not** always indicate an imminent terror attack as it may refer to a major national event (such as the Olympics). The government generally reverts to a lower level following an assessment.



- The government <u>raised</u> the alert level to 'Urgence Attentat' in response to the March 22 attack in Moscow claimed by Islamic State.
- Additional factors <u>cited</u> in the update included the conflicts in Ukraine and Middle East, foiled terrorist attacks in France and wider Europe. The update also cites the high level of cyber threat, likely linked to recent cyber attacks on government websites.
- Although President Emmanuel Macron warned of attempted terror plots, the current Vigipirate level does not indicate an immediate terror threat.



heightened threat. Can apply nationally or to a specific area. The government can apply additional security measures to airports and public transit stations.

The permanent security stance in France, with around 100 active anti-terrorism measures in the country.



FORECAST

- The French government had <u>planned</u> to maintain the 'Reinforced security - risk of attack' level until the Olympic Torch arrives May 1. However, following the Moscow attacks, concerns about terrorist activity in Europe and reports of unsuccessful plots in France, the French government will likely maintain the current 'Attack Emergency' level until and during the Olympics and Paralympics.
- Previous extended periods of high security measures (such as the State of Emergency in 2015-2016) led to <u>criticism</u> around cost and protests over restrictions.
