In the United States, Black individuals are 40% more likely than other racial groups to live in areas affected by increased heat-related deaths.

Hispanic and Latino individuals are 43% more likely than other racial groups to live in areas where labor will be impacted by climate change.

Climate impacts will affect agriculture the most, a key sector in the poorest countries and a major source of income, food security, nutrition, jobs, livelihoods and export earnings.

In addition, the poorest regions of the world — Sub-Saharan Africa and South Asia — will be hit the hardest by climate change despite being the least responsible.

We have an example of a collaboration with a local, Black-led, community-based organization that is advancing work to restore coastal habitats that will mitigate storm-caused flooding.

The project is improving biodiversity, building local capacity and strengthening the local economy through job creation.
