The Farmersville Farmers baseball team has been on a tear in March.

After losing three consecutive games at the beginning of the month, the Farmers (11-5, 1-0 District 13-4A) has rattled off five straight wins, including a 7-0 shutout in their district-opener against Ferris.

The winning streak began on March 7 in the Edgewood Tournament when the Farmers' offense came to life in a 13-4 victory over the Muenster Hornets.

Farmersville utilized a fantastic pitching performance from Jayce Fagan in their next win the following day versus Quitman where Fagan threw four no-hit innings en route to a 8-0 triumph.

From there, the runs kept coming for the Farmers. A walk, error and single loaded the bases for Farmersville in the bottom of the third, setting up Johnson to knock in a run of his own on another sacrifice fly. They plated one more run in the frame, and that ended up being enough to take home the 6-5 win, their fourth in a row.
