Class Work - Scholarly Article

Tuesday we practiced summarizing a short narrative written by a classmate. Today we will practice summarizing a short scholarly article.

- → Open document located in Group Work folder for today titled <u>"Summary Practice</u> for Students".
- → Review/Read out loud (students take turns)
- → Think about and be prepared to answer the following questions
 - ◆ Who is the author and what are the author's credentials
 - Who is the target audience?
 - What is the purpose?
 - What is the genre?
 - ♦ Where is it published?
 - What is the main point (e.g., what is the author asking the audience to know, believe, or do)?
 - What claims are made to support the main point?
 - What evidence is provided to support each claim?

Group Work - Summarizing

Work together in your group to summarize the article we just read.

- → Create a new doc in our group work folder for today
 - ◆ Put your name as the title.
- → Each person will write their own summary.
- → Share ideas among members in your group to help each other out.
- → Use JC pgs 76-77 as a guide as needed.
