Brexit is rejected



SQUABBLING MPs yet again failed to come up with a majority for any softer Brexit alternative in last night's second round of voting.

All four options debated during the indicative vote process were defeated in a huge block No vote by Tory MPs.

One – a Customs Union with the EU – lost by just three votes, 273 to 276.

SAUDI Arabia's national oil company made profits of £85billion last year — more than any other company on the planet.

Saudi Aramco, which produces ten per cent-plus of the globe's crude oil, made £23million per day. Profits were almost double those of Apple, at £45.3billion.

SIR Mick Jagger hopes to be out of hospital 48 hours after heart surgery this weekend — then back on stage by the summer.

The Rolling Stones frontman, 75, will undergo a heart valve procedure in New York.

Professor Sir Nilesh Samani, Medical Director at the British Heart Foundation, said Mick will probably have keyhole surgery.

He added: "The benefit is that there are no big scars that need to By JAMES BEAL, US Editor

heal, unlike open heart surgery. A patient can expect to go home within 24 to 48 hours, feel well one or two weeks later and be back to normal health after a month.

"The procedure is highly successful and if all goes well, it is possible Mick will have more energy than previously."

The heart valve procedure is said to have a 95 per cent success rate.

A source said yesterday: "Mick will be undergoing a heart valve procedure. The prognosis is good and this kind of surgery has a high success rate."

Heart valve problems have a number of potential causes.

Professor Tim Chico, a heart expert from Sheffield University, added: "The valve may have narrowed or become leaky, which places pressure on the heart.

"The valve could have been dam
aged by an infection or it may simply be caused by general wear and tier. It's not linked to lifestyle, the drink, drugs or cholesterol.

"People with valve problems may experience breathlessness or chest pains, which can make it more difficult to stay active."

The tour postponement came just three weeks before it was to start. Mick told fans: "I hate letting you down like this. I'll be working very hard to be back on stage as soon as I can."

## **BLOOD FLOW CRISIS**

PROFESSOR SIR NILESH SAMANI British Heart Foundation Medical Director

THE heart has four valves which open and shut to make sure the blood flows in the right direction.

Problems come when a valve doesn't open fully or doesn't shut when it should, making it leak. Either can put extra strain on the heart so it has to work harder to pump enough blood to the body.

valve replacement surgery is usually very successful and does not place a bar on people returning to their professional life.

"Mick could be back performing within

Doctors are increasingly using keyhole techniques rather than open heart surgery because it does not cause big scars and patients return to full health within a month.

## 'Escobar' lives on in drug bust

Up to \$20 million in her-oin and fentanyl have been seized at a Harlem apart-ment — including some in packages paying homage to the notorious drug kingpin Pablo Escobar, authorities said on Monday. Several bricks of the drugs

bore labels reading "Pablo" and "Escobar" and had a photo of the late Colombian cartel boss on them (above) the Drug Enforcement Adtration said.

"This organization used a photo of Pablo Escobar, who was known as the King of Cocaine, to mark their prod-uct," DEA Agent-in-Charge Ray Donovan said. "Albeit this seigure was not cocaine, it shows a sign of the times, that heroin/fentanyl are the traffickers' most profitable and plentiful product and the public's deadliest threat."

Two suspected dealers were nabbed and \$200,000 found in the operation Thursday at 630 Lenox Ave. New York Drug Enforce-

Who thought he'd be the Stone to crack! Who thought we'd be the Stone to crack! Mick Jagger will undergo heart surgery in New York City this week, sources told The Post — as his permanently pickled bandmate Keith Richards continues his

march toward seeming immortality.
The 75-year-old Rolling Stones frontman will come to get his ticker fixed following the band's announcement last week that it was pushing pause on the US leg of its No Filter Tour, which had been set to kick off

in a couple of weeks.

Doctors will put in a stent to peop up at least one of his arteries, according to

ources close to Jagger. Despite his age, Jagger still has time on his side and is expected to make a full re-covery thanks to his hale physical condition, sources added

on, sources added. Noting that normally with such a pro dure "you can be back at work within weeks," one source speculated that the band's postponement "could be because band's postponement "could be because the health checks are all set into the insur-ance for the tour. Maybe they're being care-

been the butt of jokes over his unflagging health despite smoking like a chimney and generally treating his body like a DEA evi-

The hard-living, hard-rocking guitarist called sobriety "novel" when he cleaned up in 2018. He has kicked the heroin and coine that fueled him for decades.
"Drugs are not interesting these days.

They are very institutionalized and bland. And, anyway, I've done 'em all," he told The Independent that year.

Last week, Richards tweeted out his sym-

pathies to his musical partner in crime \*A big disappointment for everyone but things need to be taken care of and we will see you soon. Mick, we are always there for you!" the puitar slinger wrote. Richards survived Nazi bombing raids

growing up in World War II London, was nearly electrocuted onstage in 1965, awoke to flames after setting his bed ablaze with a cigarette in 1971, and accidentally dosed himself with strychnine-laced cocaine a

few years later. Still, his only major health scare came in 2006, when doctors removed a blood clot from his brain.

A year later, he snorted his dead father's ashes cut with cocaine - or was it vice

"It went down pretty well, and I'm still alive," Richards recalled to The Guardian.
