In 2013, Jason and Karen Kirk launched Kirk & Kirk, an eyewear line with designs that break boundaries.

Jason grew up surrounded by optics. He runs the business side of Kirk & Kirk, regularly visiting their factory in France for in-person quality checks.

Karen studied design in London, and was working for Saatchi and Saatchi when she turned to optics. She designs each frame by hand, drawing inspiration from art, the people around her, colours and light.

Motivated by their family legacy and a burning desire to bring something fresh to the craft, Jason and Karen started Kirk & Kirk as a line to innovate and inspire. It was an immediate success, with their frames now sold worldwide in 30 countries, worn on the red carpet and by various celebrities, and on TV. Their designs have been nominated for prominent awards, and their team profiled in The Guardian and 20/20 magazine. Kirk & Kirk represents the legacy of their history, while keeping an eye to the future and the possibilities waiting to be imagined.

At its core, Kirk & Kirk is a family business with optical passion in their genes and integrity and pride in every frame they produce.

Our History

Our History

The Kirk family have been pioneers in optics since Jason's grandfather and great uncle, Sidney and Percy Kirk, realised their own optical mastery when they converted an old sewing machine into a working lens cutter. From there, they founded Kirk Brothers and opened their first London workshops in 1919.

They were innovators, not only in frame design but in the way they ran the business. They created the first adjustable nosepiece, were the first to deliver their product by motorbike, and even supported other manufacturers by aiding them in setting up their factories.

Three generations later, Jason and Karen Kirk built Kirk & Kirk on these strong foundations, and continue to blaze a trail in innovative and supportive eyewear.

Design

Design

True to their values, Kirk & Kirk design and construct their glasses the same way they do everything - completely uniquely. Karen, their designer, is inspired by the endless possibilities of colour, texture and shape.

Kirk & Kirk have developed their own acrylic and colour palette for the construction of their frames, allowing them to create confident, impressive eyewear without being heavy and uncomfortable. Acrylic is an extremely durable, lightweight material that won't lose adjustment or

stretch over time. An endless array of colour is possible through acrylic that can't be managed with acetate, the traditional material for eyewear, allowing complete design freedom.

They utilise German five-barreled hinges, strengthening the construction of each frame, with comfort added through integral nose pads.

True to their roots, all frames are constructed from start to finish in one factory in France. Kirk & Kirk pieces are truly modern ideas crafted the authentic way.
